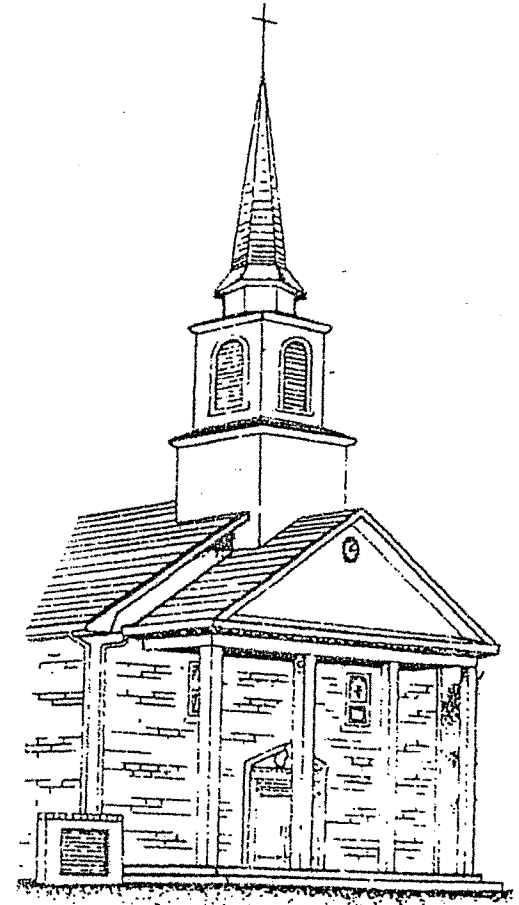

Resolutions Sermon Series
Take the Plunge'
2nd Kings 5:1-11

TAKE THE PLUNGE

Introduction – as we began this series we talked about Launching into the Deep and Dropping our Nets. Launching into the deep means: (1) meeting Jesus at the point of our failure; (2) getting out of our comfort zone; and (3) a personal commitment. This morning we learn from Scripture about what it means to take the plunge:

Taking the plunge means that I deal with my p_____
(5:11-12)

¹¹ But Naaman went away angry and said, "I thought that he would surely come out to me and stand and call on the name of the LORD his God, wave his hand over the spot and cure me of my leprosy.

¹² Are not Abana and Pharpar, the rivers of Damascus, better than all the waters of Israel? Couldn't I wash in them and be cleansed?" So he turned and went off in a rage.

Taking the plunge means t_____ o_____ (5:14)

¹⁴ So he went down and dipped himself in the Jordan seven times, as the man of God had told him, and his flesh was restored and became clean like that of a young boy.

Taking the plunge means t_____ s_____ (5:15-16).

¹⁵ Then Naaman and all his attendants went back to the man of God. He stood before him and said, "Now I know that there is no God in all the world except in Israel. So please accept a gift from your servant."

¹⁶ The prophet answered, "As surely as the LORD lives, whom I serve, I will not accept a thing." And even though Naaman urged him, he refused.

Conclusion – will you take the plunge this morning?
