Sermon Series in Philippians Joy in the Journey

Always Happy Philippians 1:12-20

Introduction – I want to begin with a question. It goes like this, how **happy** are you? Here's another question, **what would it take to really make you happy?** In other words, how would you complete this sentence. **For me to be really happy, I must have this or this must happen?** Here are four ways Scripture says we can always be happy.

I can always be happy if I _____ at _____ from God's p_____
(1:12-14) ¹² Now I want you to know, brothers and sisters,^[b] that what has happened to me has actually served to advance the gospel. ¹³ As a result, it has become clear throughout the whole palace guard^[b] and to everyone else that I am in chains for Christ. ¹⁴ And because of my chains, most of the brothers and sisters have become confident in the Lord and dare all the more to proclaim the gospel without fear.

I can always be happy if I never a _____ others to c _____ my a _____
(1:15-18). ¹⁵ It is true that some preach Christ out of envy and rivalry, but others out of goodwill. ¹⁶ The latter do so out of love, knowing that I am put here for the defense of the gospel. ¹⁷ The former preach Christ out of selfish ambition, not sincerely, supposing that they can stir up trouble for me while I am in chains. ¹⁸ But what does it matter? The important thing is that in every way, whether from false motives or true, Christ is preached. And because of this I rejoice. Yes, and I will continue to rejoice,

I can always be happy, no matter what happens, if I always t _____
God to w _____ t _____ o _____
(1:19-20) ¹⁹ for I know that through your prayers and God's provision of the Spirit of Jesus Christ what has happened to me will turn out for my deliverance. ²⁰ I eagerly expect and hope that I will in no way be ashamed, but will have sufficient courage so that now as always Christ will be exalted in my body, whether by life or by death.

I can be always be happy if I stay focused on my p _____ not my p _____
(1:21-25). ²¹ For to me, to live is Christ and to die is gain. ²² If I am to go on living in the body, this will mean fruitful labor for me. Yet what shall I choose? I do not know! ²³ I am torn between the two: I desire to depart and be with Christ, which is better by far; ²⁴ but it is more necessary for you that I remain in the body. ²⁵ Convinced of this, I know that I will remain, and I will continue with all of you for your progress and joy in the faith,
