### **West Davidson Food Pantry**



#### LETTER TO THE CONGREGATION



# Dear Congregation,

At this time, I want to thank you for the support you have given me and my fellow deacons during this time of transition.

God will be with this church at all times. We are not forsaken. God is with our congregation. "I will never leave you or forsake you," (Hebrews 13:5). Pastors will come and go. Only God will never leave us. And the presence of God is more vital to the life of the church.
