Rev. Everett Chapman served our church from January 1966
April, 1967. During his short pastorate at Churchland 68
new members were received of whom 48 were baptized.

"And he called his disciples and said to them, Truly, I say to you, this poor widow has put in more than all who are contributing to the offering box for they all contributed out of their abundance, but she out of poverty has put everything she had, all she has to live on." Mark 12:43-44

It reminded me of the poor widow who gave two pieces of money called mites. It was not much money, but it was all the money she had. (a mite is about ½ penny) it would be like

giving one penny, Jesus told the disciples that the widow did a great deed because she loved the Heavenly Father enough to give, though she didn't have much money.

Tithing is a touching subject, letting go of money isn't easy.

- I need to remind myself that everything I have comes from God. The breath in my lungs, the strength in my body, and whatever talents and creativity I possess are all gifts given freely by God.
- I need to give, because God's work is the only work that last for eternity. I'm investing in someone's eternal destiny. I can't think of a better return on my money.
