Seniors on Sabbatical soup luncheon for Thursday, February 1 has been cancelled. Hopefully we will be able to start back in March.



On February 4, 1945 Churchland Baptist Church voted to call Rev. Victor Andrews as pastor at a salary of \$600.00 per year. The church further voted on February 11, that he be supply pastor until he could move here for the services. He was to hold services every Sunday afternoon at 3 pm and Sunday school at 2 pm. He became Churchland Baptist Church's first full time pastor and was the first pastor to live in the new parsonage that was completed in 1946 as a memorial to the men and women who served in the armed services.

WMU Reflections (Then and Now)

WMU – is Women Missionary Union – this was formed around 133 years ago by Southern Baptist Women who had in their hearts to pray and raise money for Missions. Since that time WMU has helped lead Southern Baptist Churches across the country to give 6.6 billion dollars through Lottie Moon Christmas offering and Annie Armstrong Easter offering in efforts to support missionaries. Their focus is on making

disciples of Jesus through mission discipleship, leadership, development, and compassion ministries with impact in every state and 39 countries. Biblically rooted - using scripture that guides us in knowing God. Mission focused – Jesus commissioned his disciples to proclaim good news of all nations and to live out the truth he taught. Church based-Jesus gave the church authority to act on His behalf. Teaching all ages to fulfill His missions. God is always at work among all people and He is calling on us to help. No one church can do alone what many churches can do together. Missions and mission giving have always been an important part of Churchland Baptist Church. When the church was established in 1837 teaching the word of God and supporting missions was its purpose. Women of the church were very interested in missions and mission giving. The earliest known record of this in Churchland Baptist church reflections is recorded as the First Women's Missionary Society being formed in 1920. Mrs. L. E. Rickard was the first president and Mrs. O. T. Davis was the secretary. The organization began with 12 members. Under WMU other groups were formed. Sunbeam, Girls Auxiliary and Royal Ambassadors in 1929. Changes came to the community and World War II came and attendance dropped. But around 1948 interest and enrollment began to pick back up. Mrs. Paul Kesler was elected President of WMU and by 1952 under the leadership of WMU neighborhood circles were formed. Women like Mrs. Kirby Greene, Jr. and Mrs. Bessie Lamb were responsible to the outreach. Many other women followed by helping with youth and children like: Mrs. C. J. Everhart, Mrs. Thomas Hartley, Mrs. Hugh Shepherd, Mrs. Hugh McBride and Mrs. JC Brewer and there were many others that helped build up the WMU and mission circles for our church. Around 1967 and thru the next few years WMU should experience growth and outreach. In 1970 WMU names changed from circles to groups like: Sunbeams changed to Mission Friends, Girls Auxiliary changed to Girls in Action and Young Women Auxiliary changed to Acteens. Then under the leadership of Mrs. Jimmy Hilliard WMU President, Baptist Young Women was formed in 1973. We have had great leaders in our past and we continue to have great leaders now. Our Connect Group is Mission Kids the 4th Wednesday of each month led by Lisa Ridenhour and Sandra Beck with Ann Burns and Barbara Shoaf assisting are growing in attendance and continue to do mission projects each month. Baptist Young Women led by Karen Allen meet the 2nd Tuesday of each month and continue to do monthly projects. Both groups are great examples of teaching, educating, praying and giving to missions (local and international), just one example is, we had Lottie Moon Christmas offering in December and our goal was \$600 and we raised \$1,507.91. The mission projects done by these groups will always be a reason for our church existing. There are so many women that I have not mentioned that supported and served as leaders under the WMU and we want to thank all those in the past that paved the way for

our WMU and thank you to all that are serving now. You are helping make this possible for us to share God's love and gospel here in our community and around the world.

Seed of the Gospel

In the next few months, some of us will begin to plant seeds indoors in order to get a head start on our gardens. Shortly after, we will plant those into the ground to grow into fruitful plants. If you're like me, you make a habit of planting more seeds than you

need because over the years you've learned that some of those plants just aren't going to make it. These small plants make me think about how in our faith, it oftern helps us to plant many seeds of Gospel. God has given us the gift of salvation, transformation and new life then he implores us to share the good news with our neighbors. Though like the seeds that never sprout, not all will accept this great gift God has bestowed upon us. However, there is a chance some will and then grow in faith and love. In Mark 4:14, Jesus compares the sharing of the gospel message to that of planting seeds. It says the farmer plants seeds by taking God's word to others. Jesus said in Mark 4:20, "and the seed that fell on good soil represents those who hear and accept God's word and produce a harvest of thirty, sixty, or even a hundred times as much as had planted!". The gospel message must be planted in people's hearts before it can germinate and bring about the fruit of salvation. But it can only be planted by followers of Christ who know God's love and spread the good news. God has given us a job to plant and water seeds of the gospel. If we saturate our hearts and minds like farmers saturate their fields with seeds, then we will grow in our faith. As it says in James 1:21-22, "The seed of the gospel is able to save you, which is why the Lord has sown it in your heart." Over time, our growth will need to be nourished like the plant being fed, watered and getting sunlight. We can also think of 2 Corinthians 9:6, "Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously." If we love and assist each other in spiritual growth, then we ourselves will grow and have a bountiful crop that is able to lead us to eternal life. He has sown His gospel within us so that we can know it and oberve it through faith and receive the forgiveness of our sins and receive eternal life. I challenge everyone to be farmers of the gospel, planting many seeds and reaping a fruitful harvest of believers who hold the love of God in their hearts.
