Churchland Baptist Church began the After School Program in August of 2010. With only 8 students enrolled and a big mission to fulfil, it quickly began to grow! Serving children at Churchland Elementary and Tyro Middle, it focuses on providing affordable and quality care

with a Christ centered focus to parents in the community. The program offers an afternoon snack and tutoring to students helping them with homework. It provides social interactions for kids, outdoor play, group games, and more!.

During the summer months, it offers care to students in the community to allow parents to work and give students enriching activities to keep them busy throughout their time out of school. The Summer Camp Program offers trips to the local library and visits to the pool weekly. It also serves a morning and afternoon snack. In addition, it provides weekly calendars with daily themes and activities to give students fun events to look forward to each day.

Later in January of 2015 with only 2 children enrolled, it expanded it mission field to serve a Half Day Preschool program. This program serves as an extension of the After School Program, offering preschool aged children a "nurturing and learning environment that is filled with the love of Christ". Students follow weekly lesson plans and complete daily work skills to help prepare them to enter Kindergarten.

The programs have provided employment opportunities to church members and reached others in the community. The staff proudly serve daily working with a true love in their hearts for what they do and teaching children.

Both programs have grown a trememdous amount over the years with a current Preschool class of 25 children and 46 children enrolled in our After School Program. These programs serve as a wonderful extension to the Churchland Baptist Church mission field.

We want to take a moment to say if you have had a child enrolled with us in the past, have one enrolled currently, or plan to in the future, we are honored and humbled. Thank you for your continued love, support and prayers. We look forward to continuing to serve in this mission field for future years to come.
