Season of Giving October 1 – December 31

What a wonderful time of the year – Summer heat is fading, much needed rain is falling and we begin to shift our thoughts toward Fall season activities. With Thanksgiving "right around the corner", it's a time to count our blessings and give God glory – the One "from whom all blessings flow". While many of us view life's provisions with grateful hearts, many of our neighbors around the West Davidson community are struggling just to put food on the table and keep a roof over the heads. This is nothing new, but perhaps this is a time of the year when we should PRAYERFULLY consider our hearts' priorities and ask God to show us opportunities to GIVE SACRIFICIALLY our Time, Energy and Dollars (T.E.D.) to others in need around us.

The Word of God gives us a guiding principle for sacrificial giving. In 2Samuel Chapter 24, King David, following God's direction, meets with one of his kingdom subjects named Araunah to purchase a threshing-floor wherein sacrifices are to be made. Araunah is so honored to have the king humble himself and visit him personally to conduct this business, that he offers to give the threshing-floor to David at no cost. David, although grateful for the gesture, insists that he must purchase the property at a gracious price:

"Then the king said to Araunah, 'No, but I will surely buy it from you for a price; nor will I offer burnt offerings to the Lord my God with that which costs me nothing." So David bought the threshing floor and the oxen for fifty shekels of silver." (2Samuel 24:24 NKJV). So, what do we learn from this passage? We are taught the principle of WORSHIP OF GOD THROUGH SACRIFICIAL GIVING. Here within the CBC Family, I am challenging us all to make it a matter of priority prayer and action to ask God to point out to us on a day-to-day basis ways in which we can express our worship of Him by our attitude of SACRIFICIAL GIVING. I will be focusing much of my preaching, teaching and personal conversations around this emphasis of sacrificially giving our Time, Energy and Dollars (T.E.D.) for the season of October thru December.

Let's remember who set the example of SACRIFICAL GIVING for us:

"'For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son...'" (John 3:16).
